



THE LEGACY CAMPAIGN

Arroyo Grande Community Hospital is a true community hospital, providing high-quality, compassionate medical care to residents and visitors of South San Luis Obispo County. To keep pace with advancements in medicine and growth in the region, the hospital has embarked on an exciting \$17 million improvement project to increase Emergency Department capacity, enhance Acute Rehabilitation Center services, advance imaging technology, and expand cancer care services. Arroyo Grande Community Hospital Foundation launched the Legacy Campaign in 2015 to help make these critical transformations a reality, and has so far raised \$5.2 million of its \$6.5 million fundraising goal with community support.

The updates that will be funded by the Legacy Campaign include:



Emergency Department

- Nine new patient rooms will be added, doubling the existing patient capacity
- All rooms will be private and centered around patient comfort and specific clinical needs
- Enhanced triage and fast track design to accelerate diagnosis and treatment




Acute Rehabilitation Center

- Enhanced facilities and dedicated space allowing for additional therapies and technology such as the Exoskeleton, a therapeutic wearable robot
- The extension of alternative therapy such as recreational therapy and the advancement of patient and family support groups



Advanced Imaging Technology

- Convenient access to comprehensive diagnostic services
- Outpatient diagnostic center will provide a full range of services and technology including a CT scanner, X-ray machine, and ultrasound on the hospital campus
- A new MRI scanner will provide expanded clinical diagnostic capabilities and increased comfort for patients



Expanded Cancer Care Services

- Expanded cancer care treatment and infusion services will be offered in a larger space completely dedicated to cancer treatment, recovery and education on the hospital campus
- Oncologists and an enhanced cancer care team will include a nurse navigator, dietician, social worker and pharmacist
- The new site will offer a resource center including a cancer rehabilitation program and an appearance and image center, providing all of the comforts of an outpatient center with the support of the hospital nearby

The kickoff of Emergency Department construction was celebrated with a Groundbreaking Ceremony on November 6th, 2017 with hospital and foundation leadership, staff, and community supporters in attendance.

The Emergency Department will soon be doubled in size as a result of the Legacy Campaign, Arroyo Grande Community Hospital Foundation's fundraising effort to expand and improve critical areas of the hospital including the Emergency Department, Acute Rehabilitation Center, imaging services, and cancer services. These improvements will be the result of

years of planning, fundraising, and development. The expansions, renovations, and equipment purchases supported by the Legacy Campaign will meet community and patient needs for decades. The Foundation launched the Legacy Campaign in 2015, and has since raised \$5.2 million of its \$6.5 million goal with support from philanthropic community members, local businesses, and hospital employees and volunteers.

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT

In an emergency, every second counts. At the Arroyo Grande Community Hospital Emergency Department, over 85 percent of patients are seen by a Board certified physician in less than 30 minutes – far below the national average of 45 minutes.

Michael Boyer, a member of the Arroyo Grande Community Hospital Foundation Board of Directors,

has experienced first-hand the prompt and skillful care offered at the Emergency Department. On the eve of his birthday, Michael stood up to get ready for bed after a relaxing evening on the couch. As he stood, he felt the stitches from a recent surgery begin to separate. His surgery had gone well, and he had no reason for concern throughout the two weeks he had spent recovering up to this point. However, he was surprised by the unusually heavy amount of blood that began oozing out of the separated stitches. Once he and his wife realized that they could not stop the bleeding, and fearing for Michael's safety, they got into their car and headed to Arroyo Grande Community Hospital as fast as possible – before he even had a chance to get dressed.

When they arrived at the hospital, Michael was feeling anxious for his health and extremely vulnerable about his current state. However, he was soon put at ease by the calm, professional demeanors of the Emergency Department staff as they quickly did all they could to improve the situation. Michael said, "They made sure that I understood that everything was going to be alright. They saw that I was in a very compromised and uncomfortable position, and they wanted to make sure that I was as comfortable as possible."

Although he was in a distressing situation, Michael reflects on that night with gratitude as he remembers the kind, highly-skilled care provided by the staff. His nurse, Rebecca Cramer, was a shining example of this as she went above and beyond in providing privacy, comforting words, and pain-free, efficient care. An IV was inserted in his thumb without pain while his original surgeon rushed to the hospital to diagnose

the problem, which was discovered to be a draining hematoma.

The team was able to quickly address the issue, and Michael was filled with appreciation for the way he was treated throughout such a traumatic experience. "I came into the Emergency Department with an uncontrollable bleeding scenario, without any clothes on, and they quickly made me feel very comfortable. It went from being a very difficult experience all the way to being a very comforting experience."

Unfortunately, it wasn't long before Michael found himself back in the hospital. A mere four days later, he was involved in a major car accident. He was admitted once again to Arroyo Grande Community Hospital, where he received stitches above his right eye and was tested for a concussion. Thankfully, he was okay, and he was once again impressed by the high quality of care provided by the hospital staff.

Michael has since recovered from both of these incidents and is doing well, and now only visits the hospital for his duties as a Foundation board member. However, he noted the lasting emotional toll that these situations take in addition to the immediate distress and physical pain. "I am fully recovered now, but going through those kinds of situations really makes

you think,” he said. Every emergency is unexpected, which makes it so important to have an exceptional Emergency Department close to home, ready to provide lifesaving care at all times.

“Through these two experiences, as well as being a member of the Foundation Board, it has really brought to light how well our Emergency Department handles things. As a board member, I’m familiar with all of the enhancements that will soon be made in the department. However, I had such an amazing experience due to the staff – it’s not just about the facility. I would definitely recommend the Arroyo Grande Community Hospital Emergency Department to my friends and family.”

ACUTE REHABILITATION CENTER

The services offered at the Acute Rehabilitation Center are a great example of the high-quality, unique and specialized medical care available at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital. The Acute Rehabilitation Center is the only one of its kind within a 100-mile radius. The center offers dedicated services to patients who have suffered a traumatic illness or injury like a stroke, brain or spinal cord injury, orthopedic dysfunction or complex surgery. The patients undergo intensive boot camp-style rehabilitation to make significant improvements in a shortened amount of time.

Many of the patients that are admitted to Arroyo Grande's Acute Rehabilitation Center have lost the ability to walk, speak, feed or dress themselves, and their goal is to gain these essential abilities back. Patients receive at least three hours of therapy per day, five days per week, and stay at the facility for an average of 10 to 12 days. Impressively, over 80 percent of patients are able to return directly home for continued outpatient rehabilitation. The long-term benefit of independence has a direct positive impact on many aspects of physical and emotional health.

Clarence Cabreros, a young local father of a six year-old girl, suffered a stroke that had the potential to change

his life forever. After receiving the immediate care he needed, he was admitted to the Acute Rehabilitation Center to work on regaining the everyday abilities necessary to work and care for his family.

In the three weeks he spent at the Acute Rehabilitation Center, Clarence received a combination of physical, occupational, and speech therapies. “The therapy center has been immeasurable to me in my recovery,” he said. “They helped me learn how to put on my clothes and bathe myself, so that I could be independent, which was a big help to my wife.”

While the accelerated work that goes on at the Acute Rehabilitation Center is physically and mentally demanding, Clarence enjoyed the comfort of seeing his family daily throughout his stay. “The Acute Rehabilitation Center being close by was a tremendous help. My wife and daughter were able to have dinner with me every day.” This gave him the motivation he needed to get through the strenuous hours of rehabilitative therapy.

During his family's visits, they were also able to learn important care techniques to implement when Clarence returned home. “The staff did a great job of teaching my family some things that we still do today,” he said. Now that Clarence is back at home, these family care techniques have helped him through his continued recovery.

Many patients at the Acute Rehabilitation Center have had experiences similar to that of Clarence. The Acute Rehabilitation Center was opened in 2011 with 14

beds, and was filled to capacity within three months. To meet the obvious community need, six beds were added in 2013, but the corresponding support and therapy spaces were not expanded. With a larger gymnasium and additional therapy rooms that will soon be added as a result of the Legacy Campaign, the Acute Rehabilitation Center will have the ability to increase the range and scope of therapies and technology, greatly enhancing the rehabilitative process for the many community members in need of its services.

ADVANCED IMAGING TECHNOLOGY

Diagnostic imaging services are under increasing demand from all areas of our hospital. The Emergency Department relies on imaging technology to quickly diagnose patients in emergent situations. With other inpatient hospital departments often filled to capacity and a high volume of patients requiring the use of imaging services, it is critical for the hospital to upgrade and expand its current imaging program to accommodate both inpatient and outpatient needs.

To meet these needs, Arroyo Grande Community Hospital will increase its range and scope of imaging services with new technology at the new Matthew Will Memorial Medical Center adjacent to the hospital campus; which will also house cancer care services. New imaging technology at the Matthew Will Memorial Medical Center will include a CT scanner, Ultrasound, and an X-ray machine, providing a comprehensive imaging program for the community that will make it possible for patients to receive a full range of diagnostic services in one place when they need it.

“The equipment is really essential to better serve the community because we will be able to take care of all of their needs locally,” said Kurt Ramey, Director of Radiology at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital. “It’ll be more of a one-stop shop so patients can get all of their treatment in one place. Having the imaging services

in the same building as the cancer care services and physician offices will really make it easier on the patients and their families, and it will be such a better experience for them.”

In the future, the hospital will also upgrade its MRI technology with a newer machine and bring it into a permanent building. Dr. William Ashley, radiologist at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital, explained, “MRI is a critical technology for many of the neuromuscular, stroke, and orthopedic services that have become key services at our hospital.”

These advancements, made possible by the Legacy Campaign, will ensure that the Central Coast community has the latest imaging technology as well as the convenience of outpatient scheduling and accommodations.

EXPANDED CANCER CARE SERVICES

After having some seemingly nonthreatening symptoms like bloating, cramping, and feeling full, 44 year-old Daniell Miller went to her primary care physician and was scanned and tested for what seemed to be a bowel obstruction. When the results came in, however, her doctor had to break the news that would change her life. She had ovarian cancer.

"After I was diagnosed with cancer, everything moved so quickly," said Daniell. "The nurse navigator was great – she walked me through the steps of how to tell the whole family that I had been diagnosed with cancer, which made it so much easier to handle. The nurse navigator is amazing; my oncologist, Dr. Lutman is amazing. I knew I was in good hands. I don't know what I would do without all of the people who have helped me through this difficult time," said Daniell.

One special person has been there for Daniell since the very beginning. She refers to Katherine Guthrie, Director of Oncology, as her "guardian angel." Katherine has gone above and beyond to ensure Daniell feels supported

and loved through her experience, as she does for all of her patients. "When I was in the ICU, one morning I woke up to Katherine holding my hand. My family was at church and couldn't be there with me, and she didn't want me to be alone. She is filled with so much compassion and love, and I have a friend for life in her," said Daniell.

As the Director of Oncology for the Central Coast Service Area within Dignity Health, Katherine serves as a vital link between local cancer patients and care providers. With over three decades of experience in cancer care, Katherine is a knowledgeable advocate for cancer patients as she trains her team, organizes, and develops the cancer care program on the Central Coast. She shares this dedication with an excellent team of care providers, who are working to expand cancer care services on the Central Coast.

"I have a true commitment and am passionate about quality cancer care. Everyone you know has been touched by cancer, as I have been several times, so my work in our community is heartfelt," said Katherine. "I try to make cancer patients and their loved ones feel safe and loved, and I work on this every day of the week with my team, patients, and myself."

Bill and Louise Racine, longtime residents of Grover Beach, had a similar experience to Daniell's with support from the cancer care team when Louise was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer.

"The Monday after Thanksgiving, we received a phone call from Louise's primary care doctor," said Bill. "She had been having trouble keeping food down, and they told us that it was pancreatic cancer."

While Bill and Louise were shaken by the diagnosis, they were comforted by the quick action taken by their healthcare team. “A CT scan was ordered for Wednesday. They made arrangements to get her admitted that night, and they set up a double bypass surgery that Saturday.”

Throughout the long hours of doctors’ appointments and treatments, Bill stood by Louise’s side for support. “We are so lucky and blessed to have had the surgical team, the oncology team, and everyone who took care of us at the hospital. We are so blessed to be living in this community.”

One significant resource in place for local cancer patients is the Cancer Support Group. This group, facilitated by Thomas Steffora, Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist and Carol Lowe, Nurse Navigator, meets twice a month at the Coastal Cancer Care Center and offers information and emotional support to cancer patients and their families. Attendees find ways to cope with their loved ones and make short, mid, and long-term goals to clarify exactly what they will need to do to move forward. “I’ve been humbled by the variety and depth of peoples’ experiences,” said Thomas. “There have been so many heartfelt relationships that were formed not from grief or sadness, but a shared ability to lift one another up.” This resource is made possible by donations to the Foundation’s Cancer Care Fund, which also provides local cancer patients with diagnostic screenings, counseling, and financial support for everyday expenses when needed.

Arroyo Grande Community Hospital will soon expand its cancer program known as Coastal Cancer Care in the new Matthew Will Memorial Medical Center adjacent to the hospital campus. With a cancer care team including oncologists, a nurse navigator, dietitian, social worker and pharmacist, these services will be offered in a space completely dedicated to cancer treatment, recovery, and education.

“I look forward to having an expanded oncology program in the Five Cities area. Treatment and recovery is a long process, and it’s so important to have family and friends nearby,” said Bill.

Daniell, whose family travels out of the area several times each week to support her as she receives treatment, agrees. She added, “I feel it is vital to have community support to expand our cancer program at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital. It’s so important to have this program so we can help other patients through this horrible time in their lives.”

At her weekly visits to the Foundation office, she makes personal phone calls and sends hand-written letters to donors.

"When people give to the hospital, we thank them for the gift and tell them what it will be used for, the services and things that it supports, and I think they can feel that they have really done something meaningful," said Betty. "I feel very strongly that if you don't thank someone for a gift they've given you, they feel that they're not appreciated – that their gift isn't appreciated."

Many donors are previous patients that received extraordinary care while in the hospital, and the Foundation recognizes that giving is part of the healing process. When a patient feels gratitude after receiving extraordinary care, they feel good when they are able to give back in some way, and the happiness they feel is conducive to healing.

Betty has volunteered at the hospital since 2012, and her incredibly warm, friendly disposition made her the perfect candidate for the volunteer position of Chief Gratitude Officer when it was created in 2015. Over the years, she has delighted in the rewarding conversations she has had with caring community members.

"Usually, people are surprised that I am calling to thank them for their gift. I hear nice things like, 'We're happy to help you out.' They tell me that they will be contributing again in some cases. They really appreciate that we are returning the favor to them by saying thank you."

EMPLOYEE GIVING





CELEBRATING THE ACUTE REHABILITATION CENTER

When Tony Bianco had both legs amputated due to a car accident, he needed a great deal of support both physically and emotionally. Following 48 days of hospitalization and a month in a skilled nursing facility, he was admitted to the Acute Rehabilitation Center, where he received the intensive therapy he needed to return to his daily life. His wife Mary said, "Tony was a patient twice at the Acute Rehabilitation Center, and we are very grateful for the care and encouragement that he received both times. They made him work hard and that's just what he needed to do."

Within 24 hours of his second stay at the Acute Rehabilitation Center, Tony was able to trade his wheelchair for a walker – something he and Mary did not dream would be possible. Mary, a composer and altruist dedicated to using her talents and resources to make a difference, was filled with gratitude and wanted to find a way to give back to those who had changed her husband's life. "I'm very fortunate to be able to support those organizations that have been meaningful in my life. I want to honor people who are

doing a wonderful job, doing the things that I cannot do," said Mary. "The Acute Rehabilitation Center is one of those very special places that can do what others

cannot. It made the very difficult time in my life far less horrendous than it otherwise would have been."

With her love for music and her desire to give back, she saw an opportunity to make a lasting difference: she offered to fund and help organize an annual community celebration of the Acute Rehabilitation Center. This celebration, the first of which was held in January 2016, is an exciting time for past and present patients, caregivers, and Acute Rehabilitation staff members alike. Patients, their caregivers, and the community are invited at no charge to hear beautiful live music from world-renowned instrumentalists, which have included the Salomé Chamber Trio and the Solera Quartet. The charitable event also serves as a reunion for hospital staff and patients, as well as a venue for hospital leadership to share information about the future of the Acute Rehabilitation Center.

Mary hopes that the event will help raise awareness in the community and inspire others to give as she has. "Joining me in supporting the Arroyo Grande Acute Rehabilitation Center is a testament to your realizing the wonderful work that goes on there," she said. "I strongly encourage you to participate in helping us to continue this program."

A MEANINGFUL CONNECTION BETWEEN STAFF AND PATIENTS

Robert and Sandy Tessitore have lived in the community for 50 years, and many local residents remember Robert as their Arroyo Grande High School Band Director. Robert, who wasn't born in a hospital and was never admitted to one in his life, recently had his first hospital experience ever at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital. Although his visit wasn't under the best circumstances, he said, "If I had to choose a hospital to come to for the first time, I'm glad it was this one. It was a great first experience."

Robert was scheduled to remain in the hospital for a quick two-day recovery after a surgery. Unfortunately, an unexpected condition extended his stay for an additional 15 days – not the easy recovery he expected. Although he was not allowed to eat for several consecutive days, he recalls his first time in the hospital as a positive experience due to his many daily interactions with nurses, physicians, housekeepers, and so many others on his care team.

"The one thing I remember most about my time at the hospital is the nurses. There were so many nurses, both male and female, that were just so nice and cooperative and communicated well with me." Robert was appreciative of all those who spent the extra time to get to know him as a person, instead of simply completing their tasks. Some staff members would stop by his room simply to visit and offer encouragement, and he would take daily walks with

nurses around the hospital campus that allowed him to connect with the nurses on a personal level.

Another thing Robert appreciated about the nurses was their collaboration with each other. "They shared their information and knowledge with each other. That was just something they always did – they would help each other. I liked the teaching aspect of it."

During a 24-hour period, the average hospital patient has 46 interactions with different staff members. During his 17-day stay at the hospital, Robert met many of Arroyo Grande Community Hospital's employees. He said about the countless employees he met, "They really live up to the name 'Dignity' because they care about their patients."

While this was Robert's first hospital visit, he and Sandy are thrilled with the positive change that Arroyo Grande Community Hospital continuously makes to provide the best healthcare possible. "There have been a lot of improvements over the years, and I'm excited for what's going to happen soon as well. It's amazing," Robert said, referring to the transformations that will soon take place as a result of the Legacy Campaign.

Sandy, who has had more experience as a hospital patient, has also had a great experience with the staff at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital with each visit. Robert joked, "The couple that goes to the hospital


CELEBRITY CAKE AUCTION


