Dear Friends of the Arroyo Grande Community Hospital Foundation,





Our story is one of lifesaving care, boundless compassion and a commitment to excellence to ensure that we can meet the needs of our community now and in the future. That is our legacy at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital (AGCH).

Continuing this legacy is not without challenges. With growth in the South County, our capacity to care can, unfortunately, be affected by the size of our footprint. This can result in staff working in crowded conditions and patients lacking the privacy they deserve. That is why we must expand and update our hospital in several key areas –so that we can continue to serve our patients, keep up with advancements in medical technology, and create new stories of healing and triumph.

Dr. Juan Reynoso, Dr. William Ashley, and Dr. Julia Bryson – our three Medical Directors for the Emergency Department, Diagnostic Imaging, and Acute Rehabilitation Center are excited and committed to the growth of the hospital through the Legacy Campaign. Every day they see patients and employees impacted by the lack of space and the need for advanced technology.

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT

The NEED: In an emergency, seconds count. First responders need to be able to transport patients quickly and know that the Emergency Department has capacity to serve them. Physicians and nurses need adequate space to quickly assess and treat patients.

AGCH’s Emergency Department is currently beyond its capacity –serving more than 22,000 patients a year in a space designed to accommodate 16,000. Nine out of ten patients are local residents. In order for us to adequately take care of our community we need to expand. And despite this growth in the department, most patients are still seen by a physician in under twenty minutes.

The VISION:

- Nine new patient rooms, a staff lounge, and an isolation room for critical patients will be added, doubling our existing space and patient capacity.
- Existing examination and treatment rooms and nurse triage station will be renovated, helping to ensure patients get assessed and treated quickly.
- All patient rooms will be private and clustered around a new nursing station, providing a better patient experience and greater visibility between patients and medical staff.

ACUTE REHABILITATION CENTER

The NEED: The Acute Rehabilitation Center is the only such specialized facility between Salinas and Santa Barbara. The Center allows our patients and their families to stay here at home, rather than having to be burdened with traveling to be with their loved ones. Our Center provides physical, speech, and occupational therapy to patients recovering from surgery, traumatic injury or a serious medical event such as a stroke, brain injury, or amputation. Currently the Center is nearing capacity, which could limit access in the future to the best rehabilitative care in the region.

The VISION:

- A larger gymnasium and additional therapy rooms will enhance patient care, while additional treatment areas and physician offices will provide greater privacy for family consultation.
- The renovated facility will accommodate Electronic Medical Records and other new technologies.

SO MANY PEOPLE TOOK THE TIME TO HELP ME



Jayne and Jack Smith are long time Arroyo Grande residents that own a local insurance company and raised their three daughters in the area.

When Jayne was scheduled to have surgery at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital (AGCH) with Drs. Eddie and Howard Hayashi, she was anxious to get in and out as soon as possible. The surgeons and employees at AGCH kept her informed the entire time. Jayne's daughters and her husband Jack were even able to visit with her in pre-op until moments before the surgery.

After Jayne's surgery, Jack explains how relieved he was, "Immediately after surgery the surgeons came

out to the lobby and explained what happened, what they found, and helped put me at ease."

Jayne was transitioned to a patient room after surgery and describes how thankful she was for the nurses. "Nurses came in constantly during my stay to ensure I understood all of my different pain levels and to explain what I would expect to happen next. Nothing was a surprise because I was always informed." Every nurse clearly explained each medication and Jayne was informed every step of the way.

"So many people took the time to help me." Everyone from her physical therapist, a nursing student, volunteers, and the chaplain took the time

to ensure Jayne's every need was met during her recovery at AGCH. It is so important to have clear communication between every care team member that interacts with patients. AGCH strives to make every patient's experience positive and rehabilitating.

THEY GO ABOVE AND BEYOND

Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs), provide patients with comfort, care, time, support, and encouragement. Thank you to the many generous community members who have contributed funding for CNAs at Arroyo Grande Community Hospital (AGCH). Without their ongoing support the number of CNA positions would be dramatically limited. The 16 CNAs on staff at AGCH are essential to not only the patients, but to their nursing colleagues. The nurses and nurse managers at AGCH are incredibly grateful to have CNAs on their team and often express the impact they make on patients every day.

"I can see a difference in the care that our patients get when we have CNAs on the floor in comparison with the times that we do not have them. They are able to provide immediate attention to the patients many times when the primary nurse is with another patient. The CNAs are also able to assist the nurses with many tasks that are difficult to do alone, such as repositioning a patient or changing a dressing. When all of the nurses are busy on the floor, the CNAs are the individuals that are making sure the call lights are being answered promptly as well as helping with hourly rounding. All of our CNAs on the night shift are very hard working and pleased to lend a hand with whatever is needed. We love our CNAs!!"

Early detection is a key component to fight breast cancer, however most private insurance providers only approve mammograms for women 40 years and older.

What if you're under 40 years old, you don't have health insurance at your part-time job, you feel something, you're scared, and you just don't know?

Jennifer A., a patient and recipient of the Women's Cancer Fund's support, experienced this exact feeling. "I recently received a free mammogram. I am 35 years old and this was my first mammogram. I have been putting it off because I was so afraid." Jennifer explains that she has two kids, doesn't have insurance and had a friend who recently lost her battle with breast cancer. After feeling a lump in her right breast, she was afraid of what a mammogram would tell her and how it would affect her future.

"I found out about the help offered with the Women's Cancer Fund and realized that I was able to get a mammogram at no cost. I now can enjoy my kids and live my life without worry because my mammogram was clear. Thank you again for your help, without it I would still be concerned for my future."

Women on the Central Coast should not be concerned. With the Women's Cancer Fund anyone can receive no-cost mammograms, biopsies, genetic counseling/testing, therapies and other diagnostic screenings.

SUPPORTING ONE ANOTHER

Losing one parent is devastating, losing two within eight months is overwhelming, but that is unfortunately what happened to Arroyo Grande Community Hospital (AGCH) Nutritional Services employee, Trini Baza.

“My mom’s death was unexpected and there was no time or extra funds to travel for her funeral. My dad passed away around Thanksgiving which again made it difficult for any of our family to travel to Mexico. It was such a hard time for my family.”

A friend at work told her about the Employee Assistance Fund at AGCH and encouraged her to submit a request. Trini was surprised to learn that the Employee Assistance Fund would help her support her and her family during this difficult time.

In keeping with the mission and values of AGCH, the Employee Assistance Fund was established for the purpose of providing monetary assistance to AGCH employees, volunteers, and their families who are experiencing a crisis situation. Every pay period 200 employees at AGCH donate part of their pay towards the Fund and although the fund is primarily supported by employees, our generous volunteers also contribute to the Fund annually. Whether it’s repairing a vehicle, paying for groceries or housing, or even to help pay for funeral costs; the Employee Assistance Fund is available to help during times of need.

"It brightens your day and gives meaning to life." Ticity explains that her passion and excitement about giving back comes from experience and her culture. "Without the generosity of others I probably wouldn't be here today."

When encouraging her co-workers to give, she always tells her own story. "Being a poor immigrant family, we needed help to get back on our feet. Now we have the opportunity to give back to others." Ticity has always been grateful for the help she received and is happy to pay it forward to employees, patients, and programs at AGCH.

Ticity is also part of a unique group of employees called the Hour of Power, whose donations are made through contributing one hour of their paycheck every pay period to the fundraising program of their choice. Currently 11 percent of employees are part of the Hour of Power.

Last year, 45 percent of all of the hospital's employees donated more than \$53,000 during the 2014 Circle of Friends Campaign through a one-time donation or consistently donating through payroll deduction. Since 2006, AGCH employees have raised over \$235,000!

At 57 years old Betty Kern's life turned upside down. In October of 2013, Betty learned that she had an abnormal mammogram that would inevitably be diagnosed as breast cancer. Once receiving treatment from a local oncologist, Dr. David Palchak, Betty was introduced to Mary Fedel, the Nurse Navigator for Arroyo Grande Community Hospital (AGCH). Nurse Navigators have a high level of specialty training to help guide patients through their cancer diagnosis and treatment journey. Nurse Navigators help coordinate with the patient's medical team, offer community resources, and help to clarify any of the patient's questions, all of it free of charge to patients and his or her loved ones.

Betty's support team was a combination of friends, family, her boyfriend Cole Johnson, and Mary. "They make me feel like I'm not alone in this journey to recovery."

Not only did Mary help with some of Betty's concerns by navigating the many paths to recovery, but her worries of how to afford gas and groceries on top of other bills were alleviated when Betty was offered grocery and gas cards provided through AGCH Foundation's Cancer Care Fund. This fund is made possible by the generosity of local community members who want to help lift some of the burdens of those fighting cancer.

"The cards gave me peace of mind to know my gas and grocery bills were taken care of," Betty explains. "It was one less thing I had to worry about."

Betty's journey is not over, she has seven more weeks of chemotherapy and five more weeks of radiation, but she is strong and confident in her fight against cancer. She is extremely grateful for the care she has received during her treatment. From her mastectomy surgery and weekly blood draws to physical therapy, Mary and the staff at AGCH have been there for her every step of the way. Mary and Betty still speak on a weekly basis and are on this journey together.

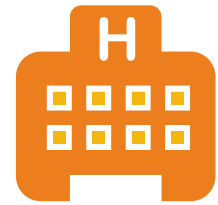

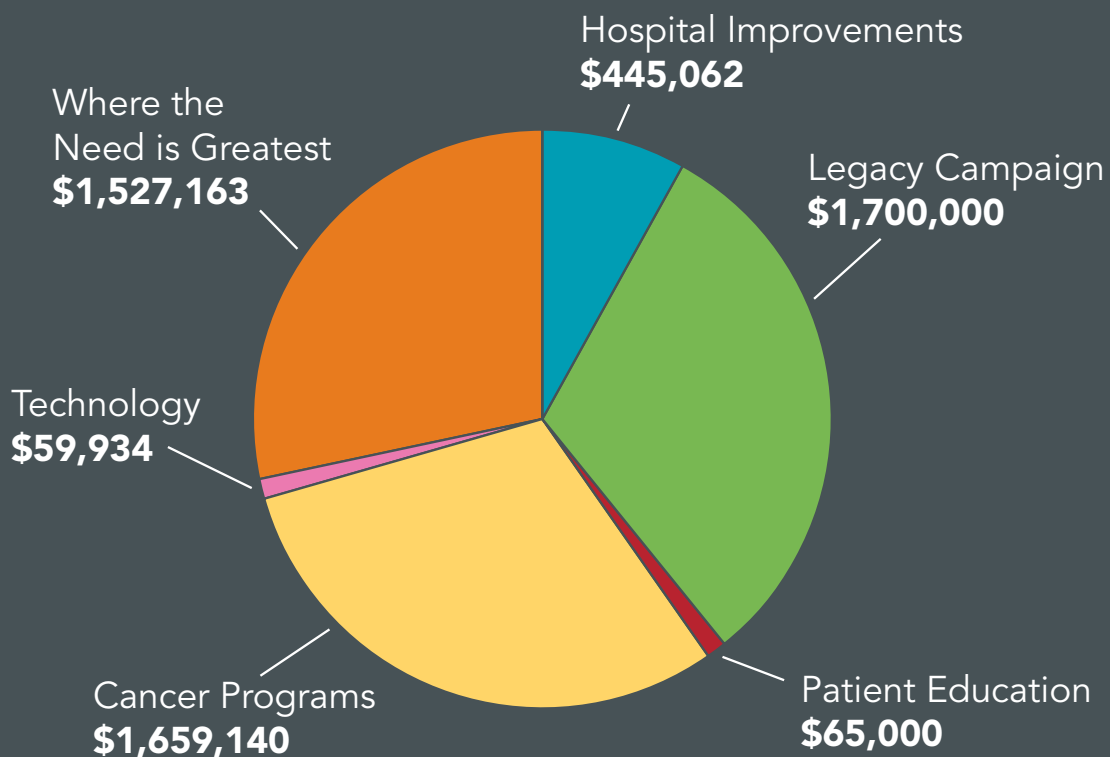
