Muscular Skeletal Therapy Fund Many patients in the Acute Rehabilitation Center have suffered from a serious illness or injury that has left them unable to walk on their own. The Acute Rehab team is looking forward to the purchase of

a wearable robotic exoskeleton – a machine that straps on to the patient's torso and legs and promotes early mobility, posture, and balance-awareness.

Community support is essential to the hospital's ability to purchase such technology. Just over \$85,000 has been raised to support this fund so far, leaving nearly \$65,000 more to be raised. We are more than half way there!
