Recreational Therapy Program

We recently received a \$25,000 grant from the Moca Foundation for our Recreational Therapy Program. \$20,000 of this grant will support labor costs for 10 hours per week and \$5,000 will go to supplies and fees. Recreational Therapy is not supported by insurance companies yet, so we rely on the community for support.

A recreational therapist in a hospital setting is focused on artistic pursuits, musical pursuits, and community outings. Some purposes of recreational therapy include community integration, cognitive skills, balance, and more to address the goals that patients in the Acute Rehabilitation Center have. The goal is to shift the focus to what the patient can do instead of what they cannot.
