Fund Report: The Cancer Care Fund provides local cancer patients with a wide range of financial and emotional

support. In FY 2018, \$119,450 was used to serve a total of 424 patients as follows:

- 159 Gas Cards
- 31 Grocery Cards
- 69 in Financial Assistance
- 77 in Cancer Support Groups
- 43 Psychosocial Counseling Sessions
- 39 Genetic Counseling Sessions
- 6 Colonoscopy Screenings



The fund also supports an oncology nurse navigator and social worker to guide each patient from diagnosis throughout recovery and connect them with any resources they need.

We expect an even greater need for the Cancer Care Fund in FY 2019 with the expansion of cancer care services on our campus.
