The Cancer Care Fund provides local cancer patients with a wide range of financial and emotional support. This includes everything from screenings and genetic counseling to financial assistance and grocery and gas cards.

The fund also supports an oncology nurse navigator and social worker to guide each patient from diagnosis throughout recovery and connect them with any resources they need. We expect an even greater need for the Cancer Care Fund in FY 2021 with the official opening of Mission Hope Cancer Center Arroyo Grande and the expansion of cancer care services on our campus.
